Eligibility Assessment



In 2017, all eligible providers will need to begin participation in MACRA's Quality Payment Program (QPP) to avoid potentially significant penalties. How will this impact your practice? Use this assessment to learn if you need to participate in the QPP. And if so, what track you will be in—the Merit Based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) or Advanced Alternative Payment Models (APMs).
