Medicaid Promoting Interoperability

Medicaid clinicians who participate in the Medicaid Promoting Interoperability must meet the low-volume threshold:

- Pediatricians must have a patient population of 20% or more with Medicaid as their payor
- All other specialties: 30% Medicaid patient population
- Or, practice predominantly in a FQHC or RHC and have a minimum of 30% patient volume attributable to needy individuals

And must also be in one of the following clinician types:

- Physician (Doctor of Medicine or Osteopathy)
- Nurse Practitioner
- Certified Nurse-Midwives
- Dentists
- Physician Assistant who provides services in a Federally Qualified Health Center or Rural Health Clinic

If you are eligible for Medicaid Promoting Interoperability program, you are required to report any six quality measures including at least one outcome measure or one high-priority measure.
